How Can We Help You with Your Recovery Today

The Integrated Wellness Peer Recovery Support Service Center offers a safe place to help people in recovery solve daily living problems that hinder holistic health, such as employment, housing, and transportation.

While at the center individuals can participate in work shops, training and other education sessions that are designed to enhance and promote recovery.

Most importantly the Recovery Wellness Center is a place where people can relax, be themselves, feel accepted and safe, and find the support and encouragement they need to rebuild.

Gaps in Recovery Support

The Wellness Recovery Support Center is located on Charleston's West Side, an area lacking high priority recovery services which are limited in availability or non-existent. Based on the recommendations made by the Governor Substance Abuse Task Force: below, this Center is filling in the gap by:

- Develop more transitional/non-treatment recovery homes and programs
- Expand Recovery Coach training and network and peer support service
- Develop more Drop-in Centers
- Provide Safe havens recovery coaching monitored
